Medicaid Managed Care

Rensselaer County requires Medicaid recipients to enroll into one of the HMOs (Health Maintenance Organizations) contracted by the County. Although some may be exempted from enrolling due to special circumstances, most families must choose a health plan within 60 days of receiving Medicaid. Rensselaer County offers the following health plans to their Medicaid recipients: CDPHP, Fidelis, WellCare Medicaid recipients only use their Medicaid card for prescriptions, dental and transportation. For all other medical services the Medicaid recipients use the health plan card and choose a participating primary care provider.

Family Health Plus

If an adult's income is more than the Medicaid income level Family Health Plus may be an option. This insurance program is for adults whose income is just above the Medicaid limits. The County Medicaid department will assist you in applying for Family Health Plus or adults may go to facilitated enrollment sites within the County. Health Capital District Initiative has outreach workers in various locations throughout the County to assist in the application process.

Child Health Plus

If a family's income is more than the Medicaid income levels, Child Health Plus may be an option for children. This insurance program is for children up to the age of 19 whose income is above the Medicaid limits. To apply for Child Health Plus you must contact the health plans directly.

Temporary Assistance

To find out if you are eligible to receive Temporary Assistance, including help with an emergency, you need to file an application identify any emergency needs with your county department of social services. If you have an emergency, you will be interviewed and told in writing about the decision on your emergency the same day you apply. For Temporary Assistance, your interview should be within seven working days of your filing an application. You should be told within 30 days of the date you filed your application if your application for Family Assistance is approved or denied; be told within 45 days of the date you filed your application for Safety Net Assistance if your application is approved or denied. You DO NOT have to be eligible for ongoing Temporary Assistance to receive Emergency Assistance.

NYS Bar Association Referral Service

When you call the New York State Bar Association Lawyer Referral and Information Service (LRIS), you will be asked what county you are calling from, and where in New York you would like to see an attorney. The LRIS staff will ask you to describe your problem. Any information you provide will be held in the strictest confidence. The LRIS counselors are not lawyers and therefore cannot give you legal advice, but will help you find the right resource for your situation. In the event that we do not offer lawyer referrals in your county, we will provide you with contact information for a lawyer referral service that does. Our service does not list Pro Bono (free) attorneys. If you are referred to an attorney through the lawyer referral service the attorney will provide you with a half-hour consultation for \$35. (Free consultations are given for personal injury, social security, medical malpractice, veterans and military law, unemployment or workers' compensation.) During your visit with the attorney, you and the attorney will discuss your matter and decide what further action to take, if any. There is no obligation for you to hire the attorney, nor is there any obligation on the part of the attorney to take your case. If the attorney agrees to represent you, the attorney will charge you at his or her regular rates.

St. Mary's Hospital offers comprehensive biochemical detoxification and a structured, drug-free rehabilitation program. Detoxification services provide medical stabilization for patients suffering from physical symptoms of withdrawal from alcohol and other addictive substances, such as heroin, cocaine, amphetamines, and inhalants. Rehabilitation services offer a structured setting to help patients achieve and maintain a substance-free lifestyle. Education in problem solving, stress management and relapse management is provided. A full range of medical services are available, as well as specialized programming to address relapse, poly-substance use, family issues, and post-discharge support. The length of stay is typically from seven to 25 days. MICA (Mentally Ill Chemical Abuser) and dually diagnosed individuals are accepted into the program. Medicaid, Medicare and most insurance plans are accepted.
